# **COURSE OUTLINE**

### 1. COURSE DESCRIPTION

Pacific Worlds is a generic interdisciplinary course which aims to develop Pacific consciousness and sustainability thinking. In essence, recognizing the cultural heritage and diversity of Pacific societies for sustainable development in a contemporary environment. It introduces students to the places, histories, cultures, arts, and politics of Oceania. Specific issues include migration patterns; colonial and post-colonial contexts; Pacific understandings of cultural and natural heritage resources and conflict over these resources; and future challenges and opportunities in the region.

### 2. COURSE LEARNING OUTCOMES

On successful completion of this course, students should be able to:

- 1. **Discuss** knowledge pertaining to the history of migration patterns in the Pacific (origins of indigenous Pacific Islanders and their impacts on the environment; the journey of other Pacific local communities; the movement of recent migrants).
- 2. **Discuss** the colonial and post-colonial contexts in the Pacific.
- Explain Pacific understandings of cultural and natural heritage resources in relation to potential conflict over these resources (e.g., mining, logging, fishing, commodification of heritage).
- 4. **Discuss** future challenges and opportunities in the region (e.g., diaspora, globalization, sustainable development, and regionalism).
