Course Description	<p>This course provides an exploration of Japan's efforts towards achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) set by the United Nations. Students will examine how Japan has integrated the SDGs into its national policies, economic strategies, and social initiatives. Through case studies, discussions, site visits and guest speakers, participants will gain insights into Japan's unique approach to sustainable development, including its emphasis on environmental conservation, disaster resilience, innovation, and social inclusion. By the end of the course, students will develop a comprehensive understanding of Japan's progress towards the SDGs and analyze the challenges and opportunities for sustainable development in the country. The course meets for a minimum of 45 hours in the two-week period. Students receive 4 Oberlin University credits with a minimum grade of a D.</p>
