Emphasis on the spoken language, although there will also be exposure to enough of the Japanese writing systems to meet practical needs. Practical use and observing of the language will be emphasized. This course will meet for a total of (45) class hours. Students receive 4 Oberlin University credits upon receiving a passing grade in the course.		
Course Objectives	By the end of the session, students should be able: 1. To successfully perform basic communicative acts in limited daily situations. 2. To speak utilizing the proper social registers, with a basic understanding of Japanese cultural norms. 3. To recognize Japanese written forms.
